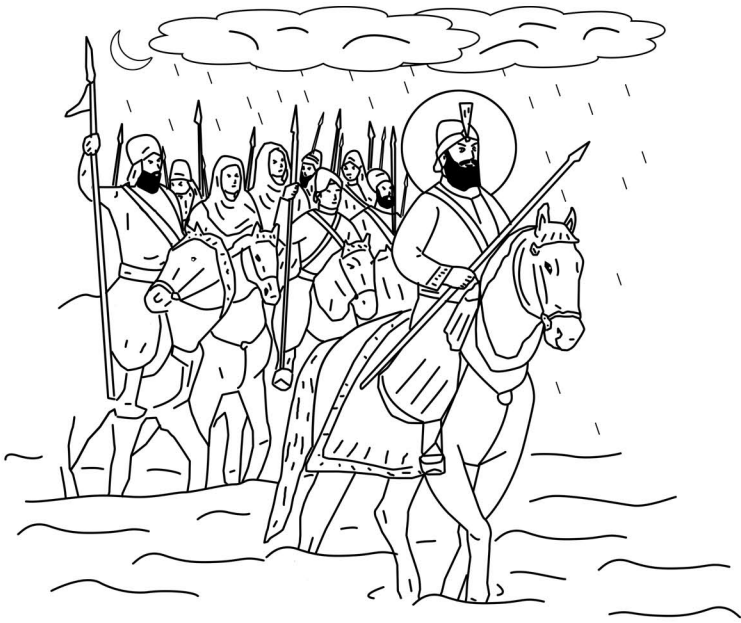


Chaar Sahibzaade - Leaving Anandpur Sahib



Having surrounded Sri Anandpur Sahib, the Hill Kings and Emperor wanted Guru Gobind Singh Ji and the Khalsa to leave the city.

The Hill Kings and Mughals took an oath, they promised Guru Gobind Singh Ji that if they leave Sri Anandpur Sahib then they will not be attacked and that Guru Ji and the Khalsa will be able to leave peacefully.

It was a cold and rainy night of 20th December 1704, Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, their Family and all the Khalsa left Qila Anandgarh, Sri Anandpur Sahib.

They travelled around 15 miles towards the river Sirsa, here the Hill Kings and Mughals broke their promises and attacked Guru Ji and the Khalsa.

In the early hours of 21st December many Sikhs had lost their lives whilst fighting with the Mughals. Guru Ji, their family and the Khalsa were all supposed to cross the river Sirsa and carry on their journey. However, it was very dark, raining, the river was flooding, the river current was also very strong and the Khalsa was being attacked by the Mughals.

Whilst crossing the river many Sikhs perished and Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji's family was also separated in the confusion.

Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, their eldest sons Baba Ajit Singh Ji, Baba Jujhar Singh Ji, the Panj Pyareh and 40 Sikhs were united on the other side of the river. They all headed towards Chamkaur Sahib.

However, Mata Gujri Ji, and the younger sons of Guru Ji, Baba Zorawar Singh Ji and Baba Fateh Singh Ji ended up going in another direction. They were guided by Gangu (who used to cook for Guru Ji) to his village.

Gurdwara Parivar Vichora (family separation) Sahib is built near the river Sirsa where Guru Ji's family were separated.
